FLOWERING PLANTS AND BULBS: (Arabian Violet) Not approved for use in California.

Avoid applications during bloom period on plants where flower injury is unacceptable.

FLOWER SPOTS & BLIGHTS: (Rhizopus blossom blight, Sclerotinia flower blight) Not approved for use in California.

ORNAMENTAL GARDEN PLANTS

Apply enough diluted spray to provide thorough coverage of all plant parts that are intended to be protected from disease, generally ranging from $\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 gallons per 1,000 square feet of garden area. Repeat applications at 7 to 10 day intervals until

conditions are no longer favorable for disease. During periods when conditions favor severe disease incidence, generally cloudy or wet weather, apply FRUIT TREE, VEGETABLE & ORNAMENTAL FUNGICIDE at 7 day intervals. Fruits and other structures which may be borne on treated plants MUST NOT BE EATEN.
