

GRAPES: (MEALYBUG, MITES, LEAFHOPPER, WHITEFLIES, POWDERY MILDEW)

Limitations, Restrictions, and Exceptions

GRAPES: (MEALYBUG, MITES, LEAFHOPPER, WHITEFLIES, POWDERY MILDEW)

plus the appropriate label rate of insecticide registered for use on grapes in 200 to 300 gals. of water per acre.

Comments: Do not apply over 300 gals. of water per acre.

Using ground equipment, spray for optimum coverage of leaf surfaces. Repeat sprays every

10-14 days.

For powdery mildew - Make first application pre-bloom and continue every ten days to three weeks depending on level of disease pressure. Use higher rate and/or shorter spray interval when disease conditions are severe.

Oil will remove the bloom on grapes. Table grapes should not be sprayed within 60 days of harvest. On grapes, do not tank mix oil and copper more than once/season. Do not use copper and oil together with fruit present.
