

RODENT BAIT FOR CONTROL OF WOODRATS ALSO KNOWN AS PACKRATS - ARIZONA

General Information

IMPORTANT: Do not expose children, pets, or nontarget animals to rodenticides. To help to prevent exposure:

1. Store unused product out of reach of children and pets.
2. Apply bait in locations out of reach of children, pets, domestic animals and nontarget wildlife, or in tamper-resistant bait stations. These stations must be resistant to destruction by dogs and by children under six years of age, and must be used in a manner that prevents such children from reaching into bait compartments and obtaining bait. If bait can be shaken from bait stations when they are lifted, units must be secured or otherwise immobilized. Stronger bait stations are needed in areas open to hooved livestock, raccoons, bears, or other potentially destructive animals, or in areas prone to vandalism.
3. Dispose of product container and unused, spoiled, or unconsumed bait as specified on the label. Note: Bait stations are mandatory for outdoor, above-ground use. Tamper-resistant bait stations must be used if children, pets, non-target mammals, or birds may access the bait.

USE RESTRICTIONS:

The product may only be used to control Norway rats, roof rats, and house mice in and within 100 feet of man-made structures constructed in a manner so as to be vulnerable to commensal rodent invasions and/or to harboring or attracting rodent infestations. Examples of such structures include homes and other permanent or temporary residences, food processing facilities, industrial and commercial buildings, trash receptacles, agricultural and public buildings, transport vehicles (ships, trains, aircraft), docks and port of terminal buildings and related structures around and associated with these sites. Fence and perimeter baiting, beyond 100 feet from a structure as defined above, is prohibited. The product must not be applied directly to food or feed crops.

The product may also be used in alleys. Do not place near or inside ventilation duct openings. Do not contaminate water, food, feedstuffs, food or feed handling equipment, or milk or meat handling equipment or surfaces that come into direct contact with food. When used in USDA inspected facilities, the product must be applied in tamper-resistant bait stations. Do not broadcast bait.

Do not sell the product in individual containers holding less than 16 pounds of bait.

Burrow baiting with Final Soft Bait is prohibited.

SELECTION OF TREATMENT AREAS: Determine areas where rats or mice will most likely find and consume the bait. Generally, these areas are along walls, by gnawed openings, in or beside burrows, in corners and concealed places, between floors and walls, or in locations where rats or mice or their signs have been seen. Protect bait from rain and snow. Remove as much alternative food as possible.

FOLLOW-UP: Replace contaminated or spoiled bait immediately. Wearing gloves, collect and dispose of all dead, exposed animals and leftover bait. To prevent reinfestation, limit sources of rodent food, water, and harborage as much as possible. If reinfestation does occur, repeat treatment. Where a continuous source of infestation is present, establish permanent bait stations and replenish as needed.

Limitations, Restrictions, and Exceptions

**RODENT BAIT FOR CONTROL OF WOODRATS (Neotoma spp.) ALSO KNOWN AS
PACKRATS**

Use Restrictions: For the control of wood rats (pack rats) in and around structures. Predatory and scavenging birds and mammals may feed upon dead or dying rats. These animals are then subject to secondary poisoning. Raptors are extremely susceptible.

If protected birds are poisoned, the applicator may be in violation of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act, or the Endangered Species Act. Secondary poisonings can be avoided or minimized by adhering to label directions.

CROP/SITE: This product may only be used to control wood rats in and around homes and residential buildings, food processing facilities, industrial, commercial, agricultural and public buildings and similar manmade structures. It may also be

used in transport vehicles (ships, trains, aircraft) and in and around related port or terminal buildings.

APPLICATION DIRECTIONS: Follow label directions for rats on the EPA registered label.

Do not apply further than 100 feet from man-made structures.

Applicators must regularly check for rat carcasses and using waterproof gloves collect, seal in a plastic bag, and dispose of in trash.

Any bird or other mammal carcass besides rats and other rodents that are found, must be collected, held and reported to the Arizona Game and Fish Department (AGFD) at 877-972-8426. Using waterproof gloves, any bird or other mammal carcasses should be double bagged and frozen. The AGFD will direct you to what to do with the non-target animal carcass.
